The Dallas Foundation is committed to supporting agencies that promote the social and emotional health of young children.



If all babies arrived wearing tiny hard hats that read “under construction,” we’d get the picture. An infant’s brain is an enormously complicated and fragile development site. Ground preparation begins in the womb, but during the **36** months after birth, the brain goes into a building frenzy.

The strength and complexity of that early foundation profoundly affect whether children prosper or struggle as they grow up. For youngsters living in impoverished homes, unstable homes, or households burdened by mental illness, addiction or domestic violence, early intervention can shore up a weak foundation. It’s the most cost-effective way to give young children a better chance to succeed in school and contribute to the community. It can help some high-risk kids develop the skills and attitudes needed to avoid educational failure, substance abuse and delinquency. Most important, early intervention can equip youngsters with the tools they’ll need years later to nurture their own babies’ healthy development. An investment in children today can change the future of our entire community.

A Message From Our

Chairman and President

The Dallas Foundation is a venerable 84 years old, but as we've matured, we've developed a special concern for the very young.

In 2006, The Dallas Foundation's Board of Governors designated early childhood education and welfare as a key priority. Extensive research had convinced us that kids who are on the right path before they start school have the best chance of growing up to be healthy, productive, responsible, compassionate adults. We wouldn't stop supporting agencies that work in other fields, but we would increase the share of our funding that targets early childhood. If we could fortify those early foundations for kids, they might never need social services as adults.

This annual report describes some of our investments into early childhood education and welfare. We'll also share a few startling facts — some breathtaking, some heartbreaking — that we've learned since we started this focus. And we'll show how Dallas Foundation grants in other areas improve the lives of older kids and adults — and even our four-footed friends. We're here for all, and for good.

The Foundations of Emotional and Social Health

Before children learn to walk, talk or read, they learn to love. Babies depend on interactions with other humans to build the brain circuitry that later helps them focus in the classroom, regulate their emotions and form social connections. In other words, growing up whole

and healthy requires more than good nutrition. It requires positive relationships. The Dallas Foundation supports agencies that help families and caregivers meet the social and emotional needs of young children.

The Salesmanship Club of Dallas has spent nine decades helping troubled or disadvantaged children and their families. Its first program was a recreational camp for orphans; now it operates a pre-K through fifth grade lab school, trains mental health professionals, and offers extensive therapeutic programs to kids and families. In 2012, we awarded \$50,000 to its mental health services for children

ages 0 to 6 and their families.

Few mental health agencies serve children so young. But some toddlers and preschoolers show severe levels of aggression, anxiety or other issues, said Michelle Kinder, executive director of Salesmanship Club Youth and Family Centers. Parents turn to the Salesmanship Club for help understanding the causes of the problem, rebuilding family relationships and promoting positive behaviors.

“Every family has strengths,” Kinder said. “Our job is to identify those strengths and use them to help repair children’s emotional health and improve family functioning.”

Preparing Kids to Succeed in School

The foundations of academic success start long before a child enrolls in kindergarten. Parents and other caregivers must talk, read, sing and play with babies, toddlers and preschoolers to encourage the development of language and cognitive skills.

Multiple studies have shown that impoverished parents talk to their young children much less than

parents from professional backgrounds. The result: Low-income kids start school far behind their more affluent peers in terms of language development.

Dallas Foundation donor Dave Munson believes that high-quality childcare and preschool can help prepare disadvantaged youngsters for school. The retired mechanical engineer helped found and still supports Educational First Steps, Inc. It sends professional trainers into childcare centers to teach workers about human development and how to nurture youngsters' cognitive and motor skills.

The Dallas Foundation co-founded another school-readiness effort,

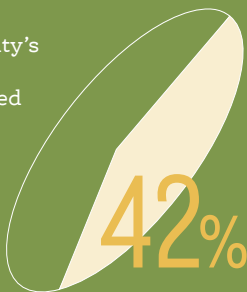
the Zero-to-Five Funders' Collaborative. The umbrella organization of foundations and civic groups contracted with four nonprofit agencies to saturate the Bachman Lake area with parent education and language-enriched preschool programs. The result? A preliminary evaluation shows that kindergarteners from Zero-to-Five programs score significantly higher on national assessments of vocabulary, word analysis, and listening and reading comprehension than their nonparticipating peers.

Of the nearly **900** state-licensed/regulated childcare facilities in Dallas County, about 60 have been accredited by either of the nation's most respected early education associations.⁵



"The University of Texas at Dallas has been tracking the alumni children of Educational First Steps as they progress in the Dallas Independent School District," donor Dave Munson said. "The children who attended accredited centers are 2 percent ahead in first grade, 4 percent ahead in second grade and 5.6 percent ahead in third grade."

In 2011, only 42 percent of Dallas County's third-graders were considered proficient at reading.⁴

The Nurse-Family Partnership works. In Dallas County, where one out of eight babies is born prematurely, only one out of 20 NFP mothers delivers early. Ninety-three percent of NFP babies arrive at a healthy weight. The program also teaches moms basic parenting skills and helps them create a plan to achieve economic self-sufficiency.

Promoting Child Health and Safety

Babies born too small or too early run a higher risk of suffering health and development problems than infants who arrive full-term. Certain women have a higher risk of delivering premature or low-birth-weight babies — those who are under age 17, suffer domestic violence, smoke or abuse drugs or alcohol, or are poor.

Now a bequest from the late Louis Ratliff and his wife, Mary, is helping improve the outcomes for some high-risk moms and infants.

The Ratliffs gave anonymously and directly during their lives, said R. Scot Smith, managing director of Morgan Stanley Wealth Management, the couple's longtime financial advisor. For example, Louis Ratliff might leave an envelope of cash on the doorstep of a needy family.

After his wife died, Louis Ratliff worked with Smith and Dallas Foundation staff to structure a bequest that would ensure careful oversight of his gift and support the Ratliffs' favorite causes. Smith said The Dallas Foundation has

kept him informed about and involved with grants made from the Ratliffs' legacy funds.

In 2012, the Mary and Louis B. Ratliff Critical Needs Fund provided \$100,000 to support the Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) program. NFP works with high-risk, first-time mothers from pregnancy through their child's second birthday. Its goal is to prevent child abuse and promote healthy child development. The YWCA of Metropolitan Dallas administers the local NFP program.

The Foundations of a Vibrant Community

The Dallas Foundation places a special priority on nurturing our county's youngest residents. And we know youngsters need loving and resilient families — and families thrive best in safe, attractive, interesting and supportive communities. That's why we sponsor programs and institutions ranging from arts groups to housing agencies that are the foundation of a strong and vibrant community.

Our 2012 grant to the Baylor Diabetes Health and Wellness Institute (DHWI) helps families become healthier. The institute provides diabetes prevention, management and care in an impoverished, medically underserved South Dallas neighborhood. Our grant helps fund its Total Recreation program, which provides fitness, health and educational activities to kids ages 6 to 17 at high risk of developing diabetes.

"Total Recreation goes beyond just being physically healthy," said Teirney Johnson, project manager. "It deals with behavior and making little lifestyle changes that will help them live healthy lives."

We're also investing to make Dallas a better community for our

pets. We organized the Companion Animal Funders' Coalition, a group of six foundations all interested in animal welfare. One of the coalition's first projects is a low-cost spay-and-neuter program called Big Fix for Big D. It's a \$5 million, three-year commitment that aims to lower intake rates at Dallas Animal Services (the city shelter) by decreasing the number of unwanted puppies and kittens born each year. In just over a year, more than 8,000 dogs and cats have been sterilized through Big Fix.



In 2011, a federal survey found that almost

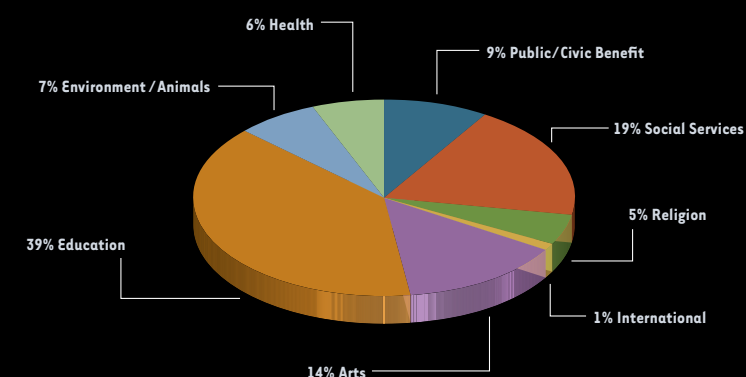

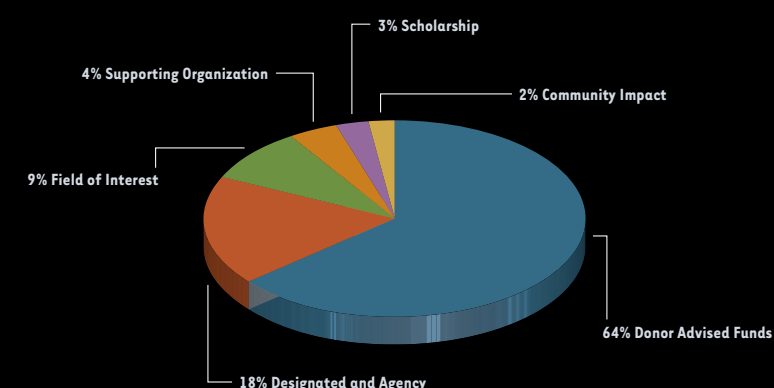

Giving
Through a
Community
Foundation

A community foundation is, essentially, a community of givers. They were created early in the 20th century to allow many donors to pool their gifts and bequests to benefit the community.

Today's community foundations offer a great foundation for thoughtful, strategic giving. Dallas Foundation staff members study local issues and needs and research national trends in philanthropy. We perform due diligence on nonprofit agencies. We work with donors to help them refine their charitable goals, organize family meetings and even arrange volunteer opportunities. We offer educational events and site visits for donors.

Because we are a 501(c)(3) corporation, gifts to The Dallas Foundation receive the most generous tax deduction allowed. We can accept gifts of cash, public stock, real estate, mineral rights, artwork, trust income and closely held stock. Our staff is happy to meet with donors and their professional advisors to devise a giving strategy that meets the donors' interests and goals.

Types of Funds

The Community Impact Fund, also known as our unrestricted fund, is our oldest fund. It includes gifts from many donors and grows in perpetuity, providing an ongoing source of money to address the changing needs of our local community. We award grants from this fund annually through a competitive application process; the grants support local agencies working in healthcare, education and social services.

Donor Advised Funds resemble private foundations because they reflect an individual donor or family's unique philanthropic goals. Donors can recommend grants to specific nonprofit agencies from these funds, and the donors can remain anonymous to that agency. Donors can also designate alternate

or successor advisors to the funds. Meanwhile, Dallas Foundation staff oversee all the administrative aspects of the funds.

Field-of-Interest Funds are established by donors, often through bequests, to specific causes such as homelessness, women's health, the arts or adult literacy. The Dallas Foundation awards grants from these funds through a competitive application process.

Scholarship Funds provide financial support to students or graduates at all levels of education and many different fields of study. Individuals, organizations, corporations and others can establish scholarships to honor a relative or colleague or encourage students pursuing specific careers. Scholarship sponsors can

help define criteria for applicants and help select winners.

Agency Funds are established by nonprofit groups to provide endowment income to that organization.

Designated Funds support a named nonprofit agency, program or community project. If a specific beneficiary changes its mission or goes out of business, The Dallas Foundation has authority to redirect grants from these funds to another agency that matches the donor's original intent.
